Phase one of our Hospital's resumption of services is progressing well. During phase one of Recovery, non-essential surgical and procedural activity at our Hospital, including elective surgeries, will increase by a total of 25% (from current case line, as at June 5). Recovery planning addresses ongoing, gradual increases in surgical/procedural capacity with decisions prioritizing the health and safety of patients, staff, professional staff and the community.

The timing of the next phases of Recovery will be determined based on the evolving COVID-19 pandemic and monitoring of factors such as Hospital capacity, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and drug supplies, and available staffing. In addition, our Hospital must continue to meet all eight criteria established by the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care. As the next step, it is anticipated that services will be increased by an additional 25%.

With the reintroduction of services, it is strongly encouraged that all patients and Essential Care Partners (ECP) wear face coverings when at our Hospital. Due to socioeconomic realities for some people, face coverings are not mandatory for patients and ECPs at this time. Please share with patients and ECPs that face covering protect their loved ones, as well as staff and professional staff, from the spread of COVID-19. Evidence suggests that COVID-19 can be spread by people who aren't showing symptoms and therefore, a face covering can help stop droplets from landing on nearby surfaces.
