As COVID-19 cases in the community steadily increased, so did the number of admitted COVID-19 patients in our Hospital. In order to manage the added pressure on our Intensive Care Unit (ICU) and the COVID-19 Care Unit it was necessary to reduce some clinical services, redeploy staff and prepare areas across the hospital to support surge activities.

Encouraged by the recent stabilization of COVID-19 admissions, effective immediately we will begin to slowly increase reduced clinical services, transition out of surge spaces, and return many of the redeployed staff back to their primary work locations. These decisions are made in consultation with Physician leadership, and are guided by principles of staff and patient safety, fairness, equity and transparency. In addition, consideration is given to overall hospital capacity, and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) supplies and staffing are constantly monitored to ensure we are able to meet patient care needs.

Thank you to the COVID-19 vaccination team for their dedicated efforts. It has been a tremendous undertaking, but the team has been highly motivated by the promise the vaccine provides to all for a return to pre-pandemic life. To those who have already been vaccinated or booked their vaccinations, thank you for your commitment to the safety and protection of all. Those who have your codes but haven't booked an appointment yet, please do so promptly. Please remember to contact Occupational Health & Safety to advise them of your vaccination and submit your receipt of vaccine at ohs@tbh.net.

An outbreak of COVID-19 was declared on our 2B Medical Unit on March 30th. The health and safety of all staff, professional staff, patients and the community is our utmost priority. As a precautionary measure, there will be no admissions to the 2B Medical Unit until further notice. For the safety of all, Essential Care Partners will not be permitted in 2B until the outbreak is resolved. Additional measures may be taken as needed to manage the situation.

Our Hospital is safe and always available to you. Anyone requiring urgent care should feel safe attending our Hospital or Emergency Department to access that care.
