A small percentage of staff who have already received their first COVID-19 vaccine have not yet received a second dose. Although the Hospital's Bora Laskin COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic is now closed, all may conveniently reschedule an earlier appointment through the provincial booking system for the Thunder Bay District Health Unit's (TBDHU) COVID-19 vaccination clinics, or at a local pharmacy. Our Hospital's COVID-19 Assessment Centre and Call Centre have played a vital role in protecting the health and safety of our staff, professional staff, patients and community members. As the pandemic evolves with few to no cases locally, along with the increase in fully vaccinated individuals, swabbing needs are decreasing significantly. As such, the COVID-19 Call Centre will be closed effective August 1st, at which time call taking duties will be assumed at the Assessment Centre.

The Assessment Centre will also decrease hours, effective August 16th, to the following: Monday to Friday (0800-1600), Saturday (1000-1400) and Sunday (Closed). The health and safety of all remains our top priority. In the event that cases of COVID-19 in the community rise again, the Assessment Centre will respond accordingly. Thank you to all staff, professional staff and community partners who contributed to the successful operations of both the Call Centre and the Assessment Centre over the past many months. Your commitment, dedication, and flexibility have not gone unnoticed.

Our Hospital is fortunate to have hundreds of volunteers who work tirelessly every day to support and enhance patient and family centred care. Like most hospitals in Ontario, we made the difficult decision to limit most or all volunteer activity during the COVID-19 pandemic.
