On December 17th, Senior Leadership Council approved the reactivation of the Incident Management System (IMS) structure which assigns specific individuals to roles outside of the Senior Leadership that is cross-functional to ensure a coordinated and rapid response to the pandemic. This Incident Management Team will meet daily and all pandemic response activities will be reviewed and adapted based on the constantly evolving situation in our Hospital, community and across the province.

As the number of COVID-19 positive cases continues to increase significantly both locally and across the province, our ongoing diligence with public health measures is imperative. On December 17th, the Ontario government released updated COVID-19 restrictions to be put in place throughout the holiday season. These restrictions were introduced, in consultation with the Chief Medical Officer of Health, due to the rapidly increasing cases of the Omicron variant within our province, as well as the significant transmissibility of the variant. In accordance, as we celebrate outside of work with family and friends, we must all adhere to the guidelines shared in the memo from earlier this week: https://comms.tbrhsc.net/informed/guidelines-for-staff-holiday-gatherings/

We recognize that the ability to travel can be an important part of celebrating the holidays and being with those you care about. If you plan to travel, please ensure you do so safely. The escalating state of the pandemic has caused the province to introduce restrictions on gatherings, restaurant capacity, events and advisement against non-essential travel. We strongly encourage you to avoid travel if not essential and avoid any "hot spots" if possible. The Thunder Bay District Health Unit (TBDHU) has also released their advisement against all non-essential travel outside of our region. If staff, professional staff, learners or volunteers at our Hospital wish to continue with their travel plans over the holidays, please note that you must follow any guidelines put in place by either the TBDHU, the province of Ontario or any Federal ArriveCAN requirements upon return.
