Masking immediately upon entrance to our Hospital and all satellite buildings continues. Our Hospital's internal COVID-19 Pandemic Response Level was recently assessed, and moved to **Level Red (Control)**. Masking is mandatory for all except for when eating, drinking or within a private office. Level 3 masking remains required at all times. We remain committed to doing everything possible to keep patients and staff safe, including maintaining best practices in infection, prevention and control. Thank you for your patience and commitment to the community as we continue to put patients at the centre of everything that we do.

The Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) department is reminding staff, physicians and volunteers to protect themselves during flu season. Influenza, commonly known as "the flu", is a respiratory infection caused by the influenza virus. It's contagious and spreads rapidly from person to person. Fortunately, the influenza vaccine is safe and effective and can benefit people of all ages. Even if you're healthy, getting immunized against influenza is a great way to protect you and those around you. You can drop by the OHS office on Thursdays from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. Appointments are required outside of Thursdays by emailing [TBRHSC.OccupationalHealthandSafety@tbh.net](mailto:TBRHSC.OccupationalHealthandSafety@tbh.net). Those who attend are kindly asked to wear short sleeves and are reminded to wear a mask and maintain physical distancing while waiting. Roaming carts will be occurring once/week or more based on staff availability. Hospital staff, physicians and volunteers are also reminded that the Pfizer bivalent vaccine is **available by appointment only** in the OHS office at our Hospital. The COVID-19 vaccine clinic will be held every Friday starting November 18 through to December 23. Hours of operation are 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Book your appointment by calling the OHS department at 684-6212. To be eligible for the vaccine, you must be a health care worker 18 years of age or older and have a minimum of three months (84 days) since your last COVID-19 vaccine dose or testing positive for COVID-19.

Our Hospital has begun upgrading the parking equipment in lots used by patients and visitors. These lots include D – Deer Lot, C2 – Coyote Lot, I – Turtle Lot, B – Bear Lot, B2 – Moose Lot, and A1 – Eagle Lot.

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Instead of the chip coins, our new system will issue barcode tickets. To get a ticket, simply press the yellow button on the front of the terminal. Take the ticket, and the gate will open up. While the upgrades are being completed, exit stations will accept both chip coins and barcode tickets. This week, only entry stations are being upgraded. The new exit stations will be installed soon after. Our existing pay stations, located inside the Hospital, have been upgraded to include a barcode reader. If you have a chip coin, you can follow the existing process to pay and exit. If you have a barcode ticket, scan your ticket on the new reader installed on the pay station and follow the directions to complete payment. When exiting, you will scan that paid ticket on the barcode reader. The gate will open and you can exit. Please exercise caution when entering and exiting the impacted parking lots.
