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



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

# Nutrition and Food Services: New Menu Rollout

### **New Menu**

- The new menu is a move away from a cook-chill method of food services to a traditional, cook-serve method.
  - Foods are cooked and served as they are made.
  - Less reliance on pre-made and reheated items.
    - Increased quality and freshness resulting in a much more palatable meal.
    - Improved patient experience.
    - Reduce food waste.
  - While more labour-intensive, cook-serve is commonly used in healthcare given it's ability to support both the patient experience and therapeutic diet needs.







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### Pre-work

- The change required a full overhaul of the kitchen equipment, which was a partnership between TBRHSC, TBRHSF and Sodexo.
  - ► Tray line rebuild the week of September 9<sup>th</sup> with use of a temporary tray line during this time until launch on September 16<sup>th</sup>
  - Electrical requirements throughout the department are complete.
- ► Change also required new staff schedules, duties and roles in the new environment.
  - Working with HR, union groups and Food and Nutrition staff over the last 10 months to finalize.
- Menu development and software links between Cbord (menu planning and production) and Meditech, tested and confirmed
- Expressly For You (EFY) menu set up on iPads.
- ▶ TBRHSC staff, clinical/Food and Nutrition training complete.







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### **New Menu**

With the new menu, comes new:

### **Delivery times**

▶ These were determined with consultation from the CNS team and with the needs and operations of frontline staff top-of-mind.

### Menu options

▶ Tested and trialed with frontline staff. Feedback was used to improve processes and refine included options.

### "Always Available" options

► Greater selection of hot entrees that can be substituted or added to support patients preferences and dietary goals.

#### New diet order

Consolidated diet entry for easier entry-based on typical usage patterns.



- What is the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada?

  - ► Following consultations with residential school survivors, the commission recommended 94 Calls to Action aimed at various levels of government and institutions, including those in the health care and education sectors.










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### TBRHSC's Response




